MRLGHRD MANDATE

- The Minister of RLGHRD is, by virtue of powers vested in him through various acts and ordinances, the Controlling Authority related to town and regional planning matters.
- The Minister is, i.t.o the above planning legislation, responsible to ensure the co-ordinated and harmonious development in Namibia in such a way that will promote the health, safety, order, amenity, convenience and general welfare of all their inhabitants.
- The Minister is **also** responsible for the <u>efficiency and</u> <u>economy in the process</u> of **development**, i.e N&D considerations, township establishment, control of development, subdivision of land, municipal services provision, strategic spatial planning, land management, regional &local government, rural development and housing

MRLGHRD's **NDP4** RESPONSIBILITY

- MRLGHRD has been tasked through NDP4 to address the creation of an enabling environment, job creation, and eradicating poverty by:
- Amending outdated <u>legislation</u>
- Ensuring efficient land delivery;
- Ensuring access to serviced land;
- Providing a <u>robust & effective housing</u> delivery

DEVELOPMENT <u>DEMAND</u>

• NAMPAB applications to Minister for period May 2012 to May 2013 = 138

- Townships Board applications to Minister for period February 2012 to December 2012
 - = 248

CHALLENGES & CONSTRAINTS

Lengthy procedures before delivery:

- -process starts at local authority with public participation and local authority decision (±6-12 months);
- -process continues at Townships Board (±2 to 6 months); or prior to that
- -process requires Minister's approval through NAMPAB (±4-12 months)
- -process for surveying and registration follows (±6-12 months
- EMA will inevitably cause further (unnecessary) delays, thereby impacting on efficient delivery

CHALLENGES & CONSTRAINTS (2)

Budget Constraints

-Decentralized planning function places burden on local authorities and individuals who now have to budget for EMA's apart from planning expenditure

Duplication

-A further public participation process is prescribed by the EMA, which is not only a duplication of funds and time, but also has the potential to restrict and even bring to a standstill any development

SOLUTION PROPOSALS

- NITRP input on amending EMA & Regulations
- MET to compile a SEA for Namibia
- MET to engage further discussion, especially sub-national governments
- MET to budget for financial assistance to compile SEA's for local and regional structure plans
