

Man apparently stuck with two musculoskeletal skins

Game criminals were less active during the Covid 19 cage time with only three new cases reported and seven suspects arrested during the past week.

According to the weekly Namibian crime report from the Namibian Police and the Ministry of the Environment, Forestry and Tourism from April 13 to 19, five of these suspects were arrested in connection with rhino poaching or efforts.

A total of 63 cartridges, five firearms and two musketeer cat skins were seized.

Mr. Munango Muhoko was allegedly arrested at Rundu on Wednesday with the muscular skins.

As far as court cases are concerned, four suspected thieves of 34 rhino horns appeared in court again on Wednesday. Messrs. Hofeni Amakali, Elias Mweutwikange, Ananias Amukwa and Viega Shipahu's case were postponed until May 19.

Amukwa was released on N \$ 5,000 bail and his co-accused remains in custody.

At Grootfontein, Mr. Frans Kalihonda, who was allegedly arrested with two food magazines in August 2018, was released on N \$ 2,000 bail last Wednesday. He will appear in court again on May 19 after applying for legal aid.

An Angolan, mr. Tomas Manuel and two Namibians, Messrs. Gervasius Sheehama and Moses Akuunda appeared in the Oshakati Magistrate's Court last Wednesday in connection with the illegal possession of a live eatery and two eatery maggots.

They remain in custody and their case has been postponed until May 19 for plea purposes.
