

Injured food stomach found in man

A 25-year-old man was arrested in Windhoek on Wednesday with an injured Itermago in his possession.

According to the Ministry of the Environment, Forestry and Tourism, the food magma was in a stressful state and with injuries to her body.

The ministry took the food mag to a wildlife veterinarian. The animal, the most smuggled mammal in the world, will then be rehabilitated and released back into the wild.

The possession and smuggling and trafficking of food maggots is a crime in Namibia.

The ministry reminds the public that a reward is being promised to people who provide information that leads to the arrest and conviction of suspects who catch, kill or smuggle ethereal moss.

A reward is also given to people who give information that leads to the seizure of food maggots, their body parts and products.
