Two Angolans believe they have 6 elephant teeth

Two Angolan citizens, Messrs. Daniel and Jobe Kambinda, were arrested last Thursday with six elephant teeth, a cowpox and 112 porcupine pens at Rundu.

According to the weekly game crime report of May 4-10, two new cases were brought and three suspects arrested.

The third suspect, Mr. Mutoiwa Mangimba, who was arrested at Katima Mulilo last Friday, is unknown. A shotgun and four cartridges were apparently confiscated in his possession.

EVERYONE GETS CITIZENS

All accused who appeared in wildlife crime courts last week were granted bail.

Four suspected rhino poachers received bail of N \$ 5,000 each. Messrs. Aldrian Musisanyani, Mishake Muhinda, Liebelo Manja and Dominic Shando appeared in Outjo Magistrate's Court last Wednesday. Their case was postponed until August 18 for further investigation.

At Grootfontein, Messrs. Erastus Dinyando, Nyambe Ndumba, Jose Mutunda, Henriquez Nzenza, Josef Nghiyolwa, Tjipepa Kahengere, Mukoya Matheus and Lamek Shigwedha received bail of N \$ 8,000 each on Wednesday. Mutunda and Nzenza are both Angolan citizens.

Their case was postponed to June 8 for a trial date.

Messrs. Matias Aroab, Roland Sitemba and Nsinano Olavi also appeared in Grootfontein Magistrate's Court last Thursday.

They were released on N \$ 10,000 bail each.

They are accused of having two food magazines in their possession. Their case was postponed until June 11 to track down other accused.

At Oshakati, Mr. Wilhelm lipumbu was released on N \$ 10,000 bail last Thursday after being arrested in January with a leopard skin, pistol and ammunition in his possession.

His case was postponed until June 3 for further investigation.
