

## Man vas with two beef carcass

A Namibian man, Mr. Harry Garoeb, was allegedly arrested on Saturday at Outjo with two porcupine carcasses.

He is one of ten suspected game criminals arrested last week.

According to the weekly wildlife crime report of 8-14 June from the Namibian police and the Ministry of the Environment, forestry and tourism, four new cases have been brought.

Three suspects have been arrested in connection with rhino poaching or their conspiracy. They are the Namibians, Messrs. Albert lilihilwa Nangolo for alleged rhino poaching at Omaruru, Augustine Jonas for the same offense at Outjo and Kefas Poronjo Kurooro at Sesfontein. The latter's hunting rifle was confiscated.

Two each were earthenware carcasses, gemsbok carcasses and firearms, as well as one each food truck and vehicle.

Messrs. Johannes Martin and Wilbard Natangwe Tobias were arrested on Saturday at Kapps Farm east of Windhoek with a food belly.

Me. Mclesia Mbaisa, an employee of the Ministry of Land and Relocation, and her brother Marvin Mbaisa, as well as Mr. Rudolf Katjiuanjo was allegedly arrested with a deer carcass at Omitara. A hunting rifle and vehicle were seized.

At Omaruru Mr. Kevin Benrard is reportedly caught with a deer carcass.
