

Wildlife and stock thieves target Omaruru farmers

A 20-year-old man was arrested at the Okarundu farm in Omaruru district over the weekend for illegally hunting a deer worth N \$ 4,000.

According to the Namibian Police's weekly crime report, only a few pieces of meat were found in the suspect's possession. The police investigation continues.

Also in this district on the farm Klein Okombahe, 31 sheep worth N \$ 60 000 were stolen between May 14 and May 29.

"No sheep have been found and no one has been arrested so far," police say.

Their investigation continues.

Four suspects (21, 20, 20 and 19) were arrested in connection with livestock theft at Gabis Reserve near Karasburg on Friday at 17:00.

"They allegedly stole and slaughtered four cattle worth N \$ 52 000-00. The meat was recovered," police say.

The investigation is ongoing.
