One of the pillars in the fight against poaching, the K-9 unit of the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism, this week received a customised Land Cruiser to make deployment of the tracker dogs faster.

The Chief Executive of the donor, Standard Bank Namibia, Vetumbuavi Mungunda, said at the handover ceremony that it is imperative for the current generation of public and private sector leaders to jealously protect and preserve Namibia's natural heritage for the benefit of future generations.
