Thirteen suspected game criminals were arrested last week and took six new business.

According to the weekly screening report from 20 to 26 July of the Namibian Police and the Ministry of the Environment, Forestry and tourism, two suspects were arrested in connection with Rhino Strotry or horn of Horalgue. Messrs. Murumbua Vetjesavi and Richard Kandjii were arrested at Otjan, and seized on two rhino horns and a vehicle laid.

Another suspect, Mr. Matheus Mukoya Katjire, was pulled up on Divundu in connection with elephant strotry or ivory smuggler and two oil fantapes were confiscated.

A total of five vehicles, seven Gemsbokkarkasse, four army sows, one living letermagô and one living Blue Monkey. A lion and a hunting-leopard skin were also confiscated.

Mr. Gideon Petrus Ellis, Marvin chips Hukununa, Morethen Katjipi, and uevening Jua Tjingovera were arrested in Windhoek last Tuesday and were seized on one living letermagô, four-year-long-power sheets and a vehicle.

Mr. Immanuel Joseph was drawn to the Outapi on Tuesday, with a living blue monkey.

Messrs. Penrich Gonteb, Elvis Anamab and Gerson Derrick Mbahuma were arrested on Walvis Bay with seven Gemsbokkarkasse in their possession. The police seized two of their vehicles.

Messrs. Rosswin Witbooi and

Le Roy Kambrude was arrested in Wanaheda in the capital last week with a lion and a leopard skin in their possession.

All suspects are Namibians.
