

Live maggot, leopard skins confiscated

One live maggot, one lion and three leopard skins were seized last week.

According to the wildlife crime report from July 27 to August 2 by the Namibian police and the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism, a total of eight suspects were arrested and three cases were filed.

Four Namibian men, Messrs. Sageus Asino, Martin Uupindi, Inocke Ndjake and Sirongo Daniel were arrested in Katutura in the capital on Saturday with three leopard skins in their possession.

Another Namibian man, Mr. Kudumu Nyambe Namukuka, was caught on July 28 on Katima Mulilo with a lion skin in his possession.

Two Namibian men, Messrs. Cleophas Vetjomisa Kamburona and Stephen Ngairo, were allegedly arrested on July 27 with a live maggot in their possession in Windhoek. The next day, Mr. John Joseph Taukondjo, also a Namibian, was caught in the same case.

They are also charged with perjury, as well as resisting arrest.
