

Two with ivory, skins fastened

Two suspected wildlife criminals, Mr. Gabriel Kuutondokwa Nalitje and David Simon, were allegedly caught last Monday in Windhoek with three pieces of ivory and one each leopard and eater magavel.

They are among the six Namibian suspects arrested according to the game crime report from 3 to 9 August by the Namibian police and ministry of environment, forestry and tourism for game crime.

Three new cases were lodged and the three pieces of elephant tusks, three python skins and one rhino horn, leopard and maggot skin were seized.

Mr. Veiyo Weyulu Nelenge was arrested at Outapi last week in connection with rhino horn smuggling.

Mr. Uaungumana Piriko was arrested last Wednesday in connection with an old rhino poaching case at Sesfontein.

Three python skins were seized last Tuesday by Messrs. Nepando Nicodemus Sitoka and Imarwa Petrus Haingura when they were caught at Kahenge.
