Francoise Steynberg - Three Namibian men were arrested last week in connection with rhino poaching and two for horn smuggling.

According to the weekly wildlife crime report from 31 August to 6 September by the Namibian police and the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism, a total of ten suspected wildlife criminals have been arrested and six new cases have been filed. taken.

Mr. Esra Kariripi, Jamunika Tukki Turitjo and Uatjitavi Lambard Turitjo were arrested at Okahao last Monday and a rhino carcass, a .303 hunting rifle and 23 cartridges were seized.

Messrs. Jonas Indongo Valombola and Stein lipinge Shikomba were allegedly arrested at Omungwelume on Friday with a rhino horn in their possession.

At Okahao, Mr. Uatondasana Delina Tjaritje was allegedly caught last Monday with 142 eating maggots.

Messrs. Lukas Kandware and Diaas Mangundu were allegedly arrested in Ndiyona last Wednesday with a kudu carcass in their possession.

Last Thursday, Mr. Vilho Shishitwomunhu was allegedly arrested with a ibex carcass in his possession at Onandjamba.

At Kamanjab, Mr. Isascar Gaingob was arrested last Monday and nine pieces of zebra meat, a .308 hunting rifle and a .22 rifle were seized.
