Windhoek (led) • Last Sunday, two suspects were arrested who allegedly poached a rhino in October 2020. This emerges from a report by the Ministry of the Environment. The two men are accused of hunting and killing a protected rhinoceros and selling the carcass. In addition, six more new wildlife-related cases were reported in the past week, with a total of 21 people arrested. This includes a large number of people who have illegally owned and traded wild animal products. Eight elephant tusks are said to have been confiscated by the police - four in Rundu and four in Swakopmund. In Kahenge, a

person is said to have been in the unauthorized possession of two pangolins. She was arrested on December 9th. Five people were detained in Oshikango on December 5th for illegally owning and selling a pangolin carcass. In Nkurenkuru two men have to answer for the illegal possession and trade of a total of nine pieces of Duiker meat. In Okakarara, five people had their rifles, ammunition and a vehicle confiscated because they could not produce a gun license.
