# THEFTS FROM FARMS AROUND OUTJO

Windhoek (km) - Incidents of crime on farms continue to increase at Outjo. As Rolf Wagner and Erika Zamzow from the Moselle farm told the AZ, unknown persons stole solar installations and pumps from five of the farm's water points last December. The farm is working closely with the anti-poaching unit Nyime, which pursued the thieves "for almost 30 kilometers to the Outjo-Khorixas tar road." The thieves were not caught, but almost all stolen parts were secured. "The locations found by the thieves indicate that these criminals stay in the bush for a long time. Maybe at some point the police will find out how the stolen parts are transported and, above all, who the buyers of the stolen parts are," says Zamzow. The items found at the storage sites are remarkable. "These are clothes, shoes, cooking utensils as well as objects that have been converted into weapons." In the past, charcoal workers have repeatedly been involved in thefts and poaching.
