The police in the Eastern Cape are searching for poachers who shot, killed, and dehorned two rhinos on a safari farm in Paterson on Wednesday evening, 1 February.

TWO RHINOS FOUND DEAD DURING A GAME DRIVE

Allegedly, the last sighting of two adult rhinos (male and female) was during an afternoon game drive on 1 February.

The following afternoon on 2 February, the bodies of both rhinos were found dead during a game drive with their horns hacked off.

An investigation into the illegal hunting of protected animals without a permit is underway.

WHY ARE RHINOS BEING POACHED?

Rhino horn is used in <u>traditional Chinese medicine</u>, but it is increasingly seen as a symbol of success and wealth.

The demand for horn has led to a rise in poaching across all habitats, with South Africa, home to the majority of the world's rhinos, facing the most severe threat.

To combat the growing issue of poaching, anti-poaching programs are investing heavily in their efforts.

Poachers use tranquilizer guns to immobilise the animal, hack off its horn, and then leave it to slowly and painfully bleed to death.
