### **Summary of the 2002 Ringing Year in Namibia**

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The 2002 ringing year ended on 30 June 2003 and the following is a summary of ringing activities in Namibia. Eighteen ringers (12 of these are permanently based in Namibia) submitted data to the Ministry of Environment and Tourism (MET) comprising a total of 10490 newly ringed (code 1) birds of 244 species, and 820 retraps or controls. Larklike Bunting, Redbilled Quelea and Cape Gannet make up the top three of newly ringed birds. By far the greatest number of retraps / controls are African Penguins (558) followed by Cape Sparrow (43) and Cape Gannet (24). A total of 153 raptors (including owls) and 68 vultures were ringed. Pale Chanting Goshawks were the most commonly ringed raptors and Pearlspotted Owls were the top owl species ringed, Cape Gannet head the list of seabirds ringed.




Figure 1. Ringing localities and number of birds ringed in Namibia, 2002.




Figure 2. Ringing localities in Namibia indicated by shading with the size
