

Pod mahogany (E); peulmahonie (A)

[7 records from 4 squares]

Tall deciduous tree with a large spreading crown. BARK purplish-grey to pale brown, smooth or flaking in thick, round discs. Leaves compound, up to 400 mm long; leaflets large, elliptic, glossy with prominent veins; dark green above, lighter green below. Flowers with a single, relatively large, conspicuous, orange-red petal. FRUIT a large, woody pod, obliquely-oblong, flattened; splitting into two thick, woody valves. Seeds black with an orange to red cup-shaped aril.

The leaves are similar to those of Julbernardia.



DISTRIBUTION & ABUNDANCE

Uncommon in Caprivi, from Katima Mulilo south to the Chobe River and east to Impalila Island.

HABITAT

Floodplains and river banks.

GROWTH FORM

Always a tree, usually over 8 m; 1–3 m high in 1724CC.

ANNUAL CYCLE

FLOWERS in November. FRUIT February, March, May and November. LEAVES were recorded in February, March and November; old leaves in May. No leaves recorded in July.

CONSERVATION CONCERNS

None recorded. Rare in Namibia.
