
Albizia tanganyicensis


Omupepe

Paper-bark albizia (E)

[5 records from 5 squares]

A tree with a single, slender trunk. BARK smooth, white to pale brown, flaking off in broad, reddish, papery sheets to expose a white underbark. Leaves large with fairly few large leaflets, which vary from red-brown to bright green to dull green; tapering tip and asymmetric base. Flowers half-spherical heads, stamens long and numerous, cream to white, petals small. Fruit a pale brown and somewhat woody pod.





DISTRIBUTION & ABUNDANCE

Uncommon to rare in scattered localities in north-western Namibia.

HABITAT

Rocky hills and outcrops, usually near the top.

GROWTH FORM

A tree, 3–8 m or over 8 m in height. No young trees recorded.

ANNUAL CYCLE

These trees were only seen in summer, when they had leaves. The only flower records are on herbarium specimens collected in September 1968.

GENERAL

A very beautiful and striking tree, about which very little is known in Namibia. It would be worth investigating its horticultural potential.

CONSERVATION CONCERNS

None recorded.
