
## Parkinsonia aculeata | Jerusalem-thorn

FABACEAE: CAESALPINIOIDAE | Origin: Mexico | [9 records from 7 squares]

Evergreen tree with smooth, greenish-yellow stem; armed with stout spines. Leaves very long, slender, hanging; twice-compound with tiny leaflets which are sometimes absent; light green. Flowers yellow, fragrant. Fruit brown, narrow, slightly flattened pods.



## Caesalpinia gilliesii | Bird-of-paradise

FABACEAE: CAESALPINIODAE | Origin: South America | [2 records from 1 square]

A shrub of up to 2 m high with feathery, twice-com-pound Leaves and very attractive, open Flowers with bright yellow petals and long, red stamens.

An easily grown garden plant that has escaped into dry river courses in a few places in Windhoek, where it is locally common. Not a threat in Namibia.
