
Ceraria carrissoana

Angola Ceraria

[4 records from (>0.5%) 3 squares]

A shrub or small tree with characteristic reddish-brown, waxy covering to the stems. Leaves **ovate**, **succulent**, 10–20 mm long. Flowers very small, pink. Fruit small, ovoid.



DISTRIBUTION & ABUNDANCE

Only recorded around the Baynes Mountains. Rare to occasional.

HABITAT

On steep, rocky hill slopes.

GROWTH FORM

Shrub or tree, about 2 m high.

ANNUAL CYCLE

FLOWERS in March; old flowers in December. Fruit None recorded. Leaves evergreen.

GENERAL

These are new records for the species in Namibia.

CONSERVATION CONCERNS

None recorded.
