
# Cordia pilosissima Woolly Saucer-berry

[4 records from 4 (<0.5%) squares]

Semi-deciduous shrub or small tree, with a tendency to scramble. Leaves simple, broadly ovate to almost circular, 80–160 mm long; light green, densely covered with hairs; veins conspicuous below. FLOWERS fairly large;

white, cream or whitish-mauve with a tubular, hairy calyx. Fruit an ovoid berry, up to 38 mm long with a pointed tip; yellow-orange when ripe; calyx large and conspicuously ribbed; densely hairy.



# DISTRIBUTION & ABUNDANCE

Common to uncommon in far eastern Caprivi and common on Impalila Island (CUR1, specimens BC1409 and 1434). These are new records for Namibia.

### **HABITAT**

Found on floodplains and in riverine thickets.

#### GROWTH FORM

A shrub in the 1–3-m height class, sometimes taller. Occasionally scrambling.

# ANNUAL CYCLE

Only observed in November, when Leaves, Flowers and Fruit were recorded.

# CONSERVATION CONCERNS

None recorded.
