


Broad-leaved Honey-thorn




Rigid bushy shrub. Stems thorny; **young stems creamy to whitish** with thorns up to 30 mm long. Leaves simple, obovate, ovate or elliptic; both surfaces mostly bright **yellowish-green**; **apex tapering to a point**. Flowers solitary, trumpet-shaped, greenish-white with purple veins and spreading purple lobes; tube 10–18 mm long; **stamens and styles not or hardly protruding beyond the flower**. Fruit a small, ovate, red berry.




HABITAT

Mainly found on plains on a variety of substrates, often growing in the shade of larger trees.




GROWTH FORM

A shrub, mostly in the 1-3-m height class.



ANNUAL CYCLE

FLOWERS from December to June, with a peak in March or April. Fruit individual records December to June, but mostly March and April. Leaves mainly from December to May.
