
Rhus leptodictya

Rock Karee

Bergkaree (A)

[5 records from 3 squares]

Evergreen spreading shrub, sometimes a small tree. LEAVES trifoliolate, spirally arranged; leaflets sessile, lanceolate; dull green above, slightly paler below; margin entire to crenate-serrate; apex tapering, acute or almost so, often with a fine hair-like tip; base tapering; petiole slightly channelled above.



DISTRIBUTION & ABUNDANCE

Uncommon in three squares in the north-west. Probably overlooked by atlassers.

HABITAT

Found on rocky outcrops.

GROWTH FORM

A shrub, or sometimes a tree, in the 1–3-m height class.

ANNUAL CYCLE

FLOWERS in February and old ones in May (herbarium records). FRUIT recorded in November and April. LEAVES recorded in January, March and April.

CONSERVATION CONCERNS

None recorded.
