
Rhus volkii

Naukluft Rhus

[9 records from 6 (<1%) squares]

A semi-deciduous, small, quite stiff shrub. BRANCHLETS pale brown with dense white, downy covering when young. LEAVES trifoliolate; leaflets oblanceolate to obovate to lanceolate; dark olive-green above, pale silvery green below, densely silky above and below. FRUIT almost round, somewhat flattened, densely downy.





DISTRIBUTION & ABUNDANCE

Endemic and locally common in the Naukluft Mountains.

HABITAT

Found on plateaux, hilltops, hill slopes, rocky outcrops and in kloofs; on gravel, clay, mica schist and dolomite.

GROWTH FORM

A shrub in the <1-m and 1-3-m height classes; once recorded as 4.5 m high.

ANNUAL CYCLE

FLOWERS November, February, March and June. FRUIT November and June. LEAVES evergreen.

CONSERVATION CONCERNS

Endemic and restricted.
