


Desert Broom


Many-stemmed, lax, **often untidy shrub**. Bark **young branchlets green**, **hairless**. Leaves small and inconspicuous, evenly compound, spirally arranged; 1–5 sessile leaflet pairs; leaflets obovate, **hairless**; apex blunt, base tapering. Flowers solitary, bright yellow, *c*. 45 mm in diameter. Fruit a yellow capsule with bristly covering.






HABITAT

Mostly along dry rivers, but also on gravel plains and sometimes in kloofs; occasionally found on sandy plains or dunes; often along road verges.




GROWTH FORM

A shrub in the 1-3-m height class.



ANNUAL CYCLE

FLOWERS variable from September to April, or sometimes later. FRUIT September to May. LEAVES September to March.



GENERAL

Roots used medicinally. With its attractive flowers and fruit, this plant has horticultural potential.

CONSERVATION CONCERNS

None recorded.
