

The orange graphs indicate the number of conflict incidents per species in the Zambezi Region and Erongo-Kunene during 2016.

The number of elephant incidents dropped by 50%in Zambezi Region from 2015 to 2016.

Elephants range freely between Botswana and Namibia, making the number of human-widlife incidents unpredictable.

The key strategy for dealing with human-wildlife conflict is prevention.

Elephant-proof water points have been built in Kunene and lion-proof kraals have been constructed in Zambezi.
