


The State of Namibian Community Conservation 2017

CONSERVANCY EXPENDITURES







69% of conservancy income is spent on salaries, vehicles and office costs.




Meat is a very important benefit to conservancy members, although quotas have been reduced due to drought.






Jobs in tourism reduce rural povery and provide career paths to conservancy residents, some of whom are now lodge managers..
