Unam, Wanderers roll on

PREMIER League pacesetters FNB Unam and FNB Wanderers both recorded convincing wins, while United moved closer to the top four knockout stages after Round 13 of the Windhoek Lager Premier Rugby League on Saturday.

Unam beat FNB Rehoboth 47-7 at home, Wanderers beat FNB Reho Falcon 40-23 away. United beat FNB Western Suburbs 41-28 at home and FNB Kudus beat Simonis Storm Dolphins 57-18 at Walvis Bay.

At the Unam Stadium, the home side got off to a great start when Camlo Martin scored within the first minute and two more expansive tries by his centre partner Lesley Klim and flanker Gihad Plaatjies put them 19-0 ahead after just 10 minutes.

They went 26-0 ahead when they were awarded a penalty try after their pack steam-rolled Rehoboth in a scrum, but the visitors finally opened their account when lock Charl Freygang barged over from a maul. Unam were soon back in their stride though, running in spectacular tries by flanker Gihad Plaatjies and scrumhalf Wilton du Plessis to charge into a 40-7 lead by half-time.

Martin went over for his second try after a great break by Klim early in the second half, but Rehoboth showed more commitment and a determined defence after the break, to keep Unam at bay for the rest of the match.

The win put Unam on 61 points at the top of the log, while Wanderers moved up to 53 after a commanding victory against Falcons.

Wanderers ran in four first half tries to take a 23-0 lead at half-time and added two more after the break to ease to victory.

Wanderers' try scorers were right wing Julian Afrikaner (two), centre Romano van Wyk, eighthman Driaan Vorster, hooker Darius von Solms and substitute back Warren Ludwig, while flyhalf Geraldo Beukes converted five of the six tries.

Falcons replied with two tries by centre Nando Dendinger and flanker Keenan Basson, while left wing Enrique Husselmann

converted both and added three penalties.

At Trustco United Park, the home side, meanwhile, kept their hopes of a place in the knockouts alive with a 41-28 win against Suburbs.

With their forwards gaining the ascendancy early on, United gradually turned their possession into points.

Hooker Callie Swanepoel opened their account when he went over from a lineout maul and when centre JC Nel and right wing Tim van Wyk finished off backline attacks, they went 17-0 ahead.

Flyhalf Rudi Pretorius opened Suburbs' account when he jinked his way over the line, but another Swanepoel try from a lineout maul put United 22-7 ahead at the break.

Suburbs put in a much better performance after the break and, in fact, won the second half 21-19, but they couldn't wipe out the backlog as United eased to victory.

Suburbs scored three more tries through prop Bolle Kaverua, right wing Shawn Mowers and centre Morgan Esterhuizen, while flyhalf Pretorius converted all four for a personal tally of 13 points.

For United, Swanepoel completed his hat-trick of tries, while Van Wyk scored a second and lock Zander Bronckhorst also went over, while Jahno du Plessis added two conversions and Hanreco van Zyl one.

The win put United up to fifth position on the log on 31 points, just a point behind Grootfontein who were inactive.

FNB Kudus, meanwhile, remained third on 48 points after beating SS Dolphins 57-18 at the coast.

Kudus scored nine tries through left wing Suramie Kambombo (three), fullback Aston Mukwilongo (two) and right wing Lucio Isaacs, eighthman Ja-Tamson van den Bergh, replacement back Diago Davids and a penalty try, while centre Scott Winborn added five conversions and flyhalf Kyle Wentzel one.

For Dolphins, right wing Jennery Xamaseb scored two tries, while scrumhalf Kenan Walters added a conversion and two penalties.

National Youth Games launched

THE third edition of the National Youth Games was launched at Oshakati on Friday.

The Namibia Sports Commission (NSC) in conjunction with the Ministry of Sport, Youth and National Service will host the tournament in the Oshana region from 12 to 14 September, featuring 13 sport codes. These range from athletics, karate, volleyball, netball, basketball, tennis, table tennis, boxing, e-sports, swimming and baseball, among others.

The first edition of the under-20 youth tournament took place in Windhoek in 2018 and the second edition was held in 2020.

The 2023 National Youth Games, scheduled for December last year, were cancelled because the contractual agreement with the main sponsor, Mobile Telecommunications Limited (MTC), expired.

Speaking at the launch, NSC chief administrator Freddy Mwiya said at its inception, they saw the need to have games that bring all regions together to capacitate coaches, technical officials and the youth of the country.

Mwiya said in 2020, MTC sponsored the second edition which was hosted in the Otjozondjupa region.

"Yes, the second edition was a good event but there were challenges which we must admit to, however, we have learnt from them. One of them was financial

challenges because the budget which was allocated was very limited and we lost our sponsors, but we did not give up," Mwiya said.

He further said the decision to host the games this year was made in April.

A Namibian team to represent the country at the African Union Sport Council Region 5 Games will be selected at the youth games in September, he added.

"The participants will be accommodated at five government hostels that will cost us N\$30 per athlete for four days which translates into N\$370 000," he said.

Speaking at the same event, project director Tjeripo Musutua said a total of 2 607 participants are expected.

He noted that the games will be played at different sport facilities at Ondangwa, Ongwediva and Oshakati.

"We are expecting all regions to conclude with their trials and submit names of players by 31 July. Funds have already been made available through the line ministry to ensure that regions conduct just and fair trials," Musutua said.

Musutua added that Namibia will host the Region 5 Youth Games next year.

Oshana regional governor Elia Irimari called on Namibians to come on board to support the youth games.

"It is our duty to call upon Namibians who understand that it is through sports that we can fortify, unify and enhance the development of our country," Irimari said.

Promising cross-cultural fantasy

IF there's a people living along the banks of a river or beside the shore of the sea, there is a story about what dwells in the water.

In 'Momeya' (2023), a short film written and directed by Ndakalako Shilongo, the cross-cultural myths of aquatic deities, peoples and legends come to life at the edge of an ancient river.

Amid its murky depths, earthbound men have attacked a water people and a vengeful water goddess washes ashore.

Presented to an enraptured crowd at the Goethe-Institut of Namibia's Cinemaverse recently, the non-dialogue film stars Ebba Shambwila,

Ute-Yan Smith and Bret Kamwi as the fiery water goddess, a young girl named Letu and as the girl's budding love interest, respectively.

At the river, Letu hesitates to gather water before her companion assists her.

The injured water goddess watches, and when Letu returns alone on another day, the young girl's life is forever changed.

The audience praised the cinematography, director of photography Thabiso Dube's agile, moving camera, a young watcher suggests queer undertones and everyone is struck by the story's deep familiarity.

Born in the tales that Shilongo would hear, the writer and director hoped

'Momeya' would be a point of cross-cultural meeting.

"When 'Momeya' came to me I heard it in Oshiwambo, but I was very intentional with taking away dialogue," Shilongo says.

"I wanted everyone who watches 'Momeya' to hear it in their own vernacular."

While 'Momeya' is strikingly shot and certainly transportive, making the short was no easy feat, and the resulting film is testimony to the dedication of its cast and crew.

"The location was 50kms outside Windhoek. It's about 30km of gravel and nobody wanted to take us there," says Dube.

"I think the story of how we actually put this film together could become a film in itself—how a lot of film-makers in Namibia are struggling to put their productions together."

'Momeya' was shot over three and a half days in 2022 and in 2023.

"We ran out of money," says Shilongo of the extended time between filming and release.

The challenge of funding is evident. While 'Momeya' does impress in its costuming, acting and relatable narrative, there is a sense that this could have been a deeper, multi-location and more immersive story.

'Momeya' entices. Not only for its subject matter, but as a dive into the

genre of fantasy, which still lacks exploration and experimentation in the Namibian cinema scene.

'Momeya's' experimentation is most remarkable in the choice to be without dialogue, which heightens the expectation of its actors who were tasked to convey story and emotion through physicality and expression.

In this, Shambwila, Smith and Kamwi were prepared diligently.

"As an actor, it's important for me to understand the story and communicate with the writer and director to understand what drives my character," Shambwila says.

"Our characters, they're water goddesses,

they have this animalistic instinct. So I had to take into consideration how an animal acts when happy, when feeling safe, when angry," Shambwila says.


