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1. STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

1.1 EIA Regulations

Section 21 of the EIA regulation outlines the Public Participation Process (PPP). PPP is an important process, because it gives members of the public and Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs), an opportunity to comment or raise concerns that may affect the socio-economic or general environment because of the project.

1.2 Newspaper Adverts

Section 21 (c) stipulates that ECC applications should be advertised once a week for two consecutive weeks in two newspapers that are widely circulated in Namibia.

The ECC application was advertised in the New Era and Republikein Newspapers (Appendix 2 and 3).

1.3 Public Meetings

Section 21 (5,6) requires that public meeting/s should be held near the project site to inform the public about the project and subsequent submission of the ECC application to the Environmental Commissioner.

A community meeting was held on 10th August 2024, at the Community Settlement, Dimab Pos, Bloupoort Farm, Twyfelfontein (figure 1.1 to 1.3).



The Capricorn Foundation recently donated 10 infusion pumps valued at N\$264 500 to the Gobabis State Hospital paediatric ward. These pumps are essential for administering fluids to malnourished children admitted to the ward. Veripura Muukua, Capricorn Foundation coordinator, in an interview with Nampa on Tuesday said the pumps were handed over last week.

She said approximately 2 000 cases of malnutrition were registered in Namibia this year, with 300 cases in the Omaheke region alone between January and June 2024. The Capricorn Foundation's health focus area strives to improve health outcomes by improving nutrition and increasing access to healthcare, she noted.

"We are grateful that we can make a difference in the lives of Namibians, especially children. Our support for the Gobabis State Hospital paediatric ward falls under our health focus area, where we address health-related issues and support better health outcomes," she said. Muukua said in March 2024, representatives from the foundation visited the Gobabis State Hospital paediatric ward

to understand the malnutrition situation in the Omaheke region, and identify ways to provide support. In response to the hospital's urgent needs, the Capricorn Foundation purchased 10 infusion pumps for the paediatric ward.

This donation builds on previous support, including providing nutritional and protein-rich food items, valued at N\$291 000 in February 2024 through a partnership with the Nutrition and Food Security Alliance of Namibia.

The infusion pumps and previous nutritional support are part of the Capricorn Foundation's broader effort to address health-related issues, and improve health outcomes in Namibia, particularly in regions severely affected by malnutrition. Governor of the Omaheke region Pijoo Nganate noted that the malnutrition crisis has been exacerbated by drought and food insecurity in the region. "I express my sincere gratitude to the Capricorn Foundation for donating these infusion pumps to the Gobabis District Hospital paediatric ward; our most vulnerable are children.

They cannot stand for themselves. This donation comes at a critical time, and demonstrates the importance of collaborative efforts in improving healthcare services," he said.

demonstrated an outstanding commitment to address housing challenges in Namibia.

The deputy minister said this during the groundbreaking ceremony of the Shack Dwellers Housing Project at Katjinakatji, a village between Rundu and Mururani along the Rundu-Grootfontein road.

It is in the Mankumpi constituency of the Kavango West region.

On Friday, 21 members of Katjinakatji Shack Dwellers, mainly women, received their plots as beneficiaries of Phase 1 of the project, while 42 will be constructed in second phase.

The project marks the beginning of modern houses in the village, which is set to be declared as a settlement soon.

"Housing is not merely a basic necessity, it is a fundamental right. A home provides security, dignity and a solid foundation upon which individuals and families can build their futures. Today, as we break ground, we are not just initiating the construction of new homes. We are laying the groundwork for hope, opportunity and an improved quality of life for many in our community," she said.

!Nawases-Taeyele added: "This housing initiative is vital for several reasons. It aims to improve the living conditions of our people, as many currently endure inadequate housing".

The project, she hastened to note, will provide safe, stable and decent housing, which is essential for their health and well-being. It also embodies community development, as housing projects are about more than just constructing buildings—they are about fostering communities. "These new homes will cultivate a sense of belonging and community spirit among residents," she noted.

The housing initiative is expected to drive economic empowerment in the village by stimulating the local economy.

The deputy minister highlighted that construction projects create jobs, and improved living conditions enable residents to better pursue economic opportunities.


