Although the area is poorly vegetated since it is a desert, only existing tracks will be used to access the site. A vegetation management plan will be formulated and, if protected plant species and high valued plant species are encountered, they will be avoided.

All vehicles and machineries will be serviced regularly to ensure no soil contamination and if any oil leakage detected a drip tray will be used.

Operation hours will be from 08h00am to 17h00pm, Monday to Friday, no work will be allowed during dusk hours. 3.2.3 How will you control the movement of vehicles and machinery in order to minimize environmental damage? Only existing tracks will be used during operation, no new roads or tracks will be established. No off-road driving will be permitted at the site.
