Although the area is poorly vegetated since it is a dry area, the existing tracks will be used to access the site. The area is a dry area, with mostly bushes and grass. No mining will take place where plants are found. A vegetation management plant will be formulated and, if protected plant species and high valued plant species are encountered, they will be avoided.

All vehicles will be serviced regularly to ensure no soil contamination and if any oil leakage detected a drip tray will be used. No heavy machinery will be used.

All employees will be provided with correct Personal Protect Equipment (PPE).

Operation hours will be from 08h00am to 17h00pm, Monday to Friday, no work will be allowed during dusk hours.


