**Although the area is poorly vegetated since it is a dry area, the existing tracks will be used to access the site. The area is a dry area, with mostly bushes and grass. No mining will take place where plants are found. A vegetation management plan will be formulated and, if protected plant species and high valued plant species are encountered, they will be avoided.**

**All vehicles will be serviced regularly to ensure no soil contamination and if any oil leakage detected a drip tray will be used. No heavy machinery will be used.**

**All employees will be provided with correct Personal Protect Equipment (PPE).  
Operation hours will be from 08h00am to 17h00pm, Monday to Friday, no work will be allowed during dusk hours.**

- 3.2.3 How will you control the movement of vehicles **and machinery** in order to minimize environmental damage?

**Only existing tracks will be used during operation, no new roads or tracks will be established.**

**No off-road driving will be permitted on site. An assistant environmental officer will be appointed to ensure compliance.**

**The Opuwo-Sesfontein main road will be used.**

Vehicles will be serviced regularly to avoid oil or fuel leakage and any oil/fuel spillage detected will be attended to by a professional company as soon as possible. No heavy machinery will be used. It is a small miners operation with hand tools.
