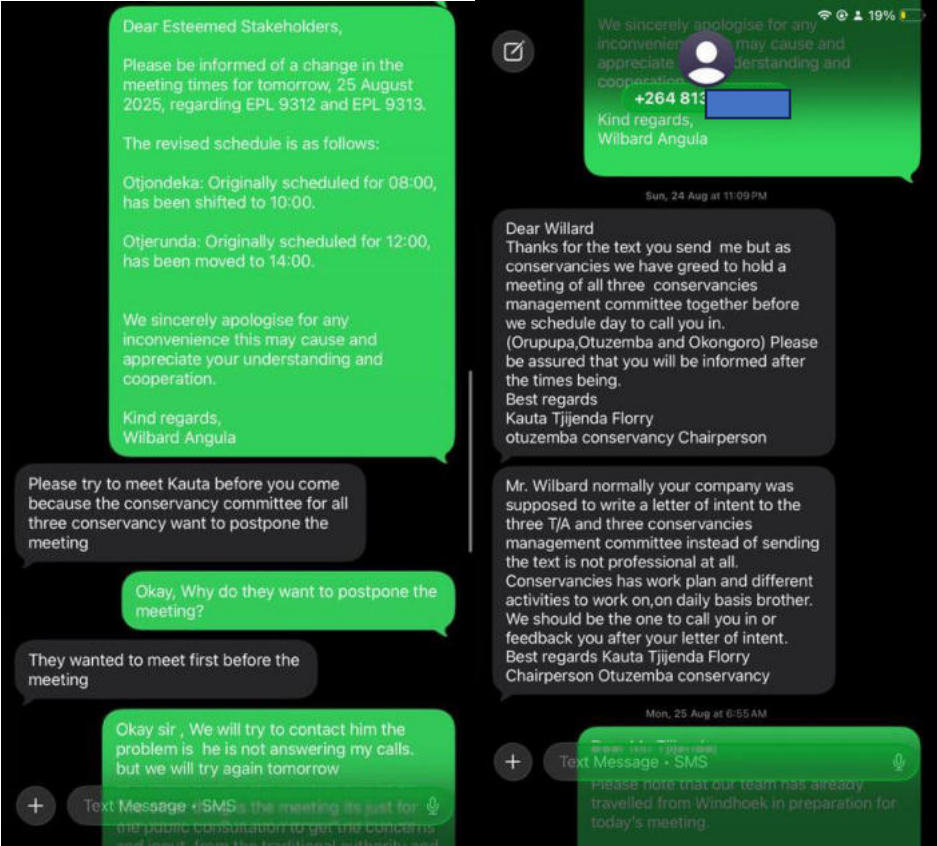


**Written notice to landowners.**
