TOWN PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENTAL PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES

TOWNSHIP ESTABLISHMENT OF OMUNGWELUME EXTENSION 2

Date: Saturday, 5 July 2025

Time: 12h00

Purpose of fact-finding meeting:

- a) To present the proposed town planning layouts and environmental processes for Omungwelume Extensions 2, 3, and 4.
- b) To explain the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process and provide relevant information on the proposed development.
- c) To gather public input and identify potential environmental and planning concerns.

Meeting proceedings:

The meeting commenced with a registration process, followed by an official opening by Mr. Fillipus Shimhanda. The Honorable Councilor welcomed attendees and emphasized the importance of inclusive development and community participation. Mr. P. Shomongula then provided introductory remarks, outlining the appointment of SPC as the consulting firm responsible for the town planning and EIA processes. He also gave a brief historical overview of development efforts in the area.

Ms. lipumbu from SPC delivered a comprehensive presentation in Oshiwambo, covering both the town planning and EIA components. Key points included:

- a) The phased implementation of the development, with Extension 2 being prioritized;
- b) The EIA process covering all three extensions (2, 3, and 4);
- c) Layouts informed by existing household structures, access routes, and topography;
- d) Legal and procedural requirements under the Environmental Management Act No. 7 of 2007 and EIA Regulations (GN No. 30 of 2012);
- e) Activities triggering the EIA, including road and bulk infrastructure development;
- f) A 500-meter buffer zone around oxidation ponds; and
- g) Zoning clarifications, including one erf designated as "undetermined";

Those present were given the opportunity to ask questions, provide inputs/comments as well as register as an interested and affected person.

The questions and inputs raised during the meetings are reflected below:
