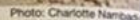

# Swapo aims to conquer Kunene

OPUWO - With five of the seven constituencies in its pocket, Swapo wants to take over the remaining two constituencies during the upcoming regional and local authorities' elections in the Kunene region.

The elections are slated for November. The sentiments were aired by Swapo's regional coordinator for Kunene, Tuarungwa Kavari, in an interview with Nampsa on Saturday.

Kavari said the ruling party will go into the upcoming election with a "take it all" mentality. He said the ruling party struggled to infiltrate the Kunene region, particularly in the 90s and early 2000s as the region was dominated by the United Democratic Front (UDF) then DTA (now Popular Democratic Movement (PDM)).

But fortunes changed for the former liberation movement in 2014 national elections and 2015 regional and local authorities' elections when it made significant inroads in the Kunene territory when it scooped five of the seven constituencies.

Kavari attributed this to his party's commitment to bring development to the people. "As a party, we are prepared for

the regional and local authorities' elections come November although there is a challenge with the Covid-19 pandemic," he said.

According to him, a well-

organised Swapo gathering brings together more 300 supporters which is not practical at this stage due to the state of emergency regulations. In a fortnight's time, Swapo

will release names of its candidates for the upcoming elections. "Swapo has rules and procedures," he said. So far, several young inhabitants of the region have taken to social media indicating their intentions to contest in the upcoming elections as independent candidates.

In the meantime, observations indicate that the presence of the Landless People's Movement (LPM) is being felt in the region, particularly in the Otjojo, Kamanjab and Khorixas local authority areas.

Meanwhile, PDM remains very strong in the Opuwo urban and rural constituencies as well as Epupa.

However, for Kavari and Swapo,

elections are meant to be contested in democratic dispensations such as Namibia.

He added: "It's true that after independence, the opposition ruled Kunene Region. We only have one constituency [Otjojo], but you would realise that in the 2015 and 2019 elections, we Swapo made inroads in terms of the support of the region. We happen to have five constituencies and in the local authorities and village councils, we are the majority. We are ruling this region."

And we are prepared to work hard, come election time. We are determined to keep our constituencies."

## Community pleads for safe drinking water

OMUTHIYA - The community of Choi in Kongola constituency of the Zambezi region has appealed to the authorities to fast-track the provision of water, as they are forced to trek long distances to fetch water from nearby villages.

Residents argued this should be treated with urgency, considering the Covid-19 pandemic, thus they are unable to do regular hand washing which is deemed crucial in the fight against the pandemic.

Government had earlier this year directed regional councils and local authorities to provide water to the communities for free and also connect those whose water was cut.

The community had approached the councillor's office requesting for water provision after which it was resolved that villages will be connected from a local school which has a solar-powered borehole.

"We dug the trenches long ago, but we don't know where the holdup is, yet there is a virus crisis to which water is vital in the fight. We are also concerned that the solar panels pumping water are of low capacity of which we fear it might not be able to pump enough to cater for the large community. As it stands, one of the tanks installed at the school does not even get filled up, due to low solar capacity."

Kongola councillor David Muluti said the issue is being addressed and it is in the hands of the ministry of works to do the connections.

"I took the matter up with the directorate of education and it was agreed the community can be connected to the school water system. Therefore, we are waiting for the ministry of works to come do the work, which I believe will be soon," responded Muluti.

Furthermore, the councillor said the water crisis in the constituency is rife even though there are a total of 11 boreholes to be drilled and rehabilitated.

The problem is due to ageing infrastructure and the drought which has seen ground water drying up, said Muluti.

"As such, we will have to rehabilitate some boreholes, by also deepening and replacing the pipes as some boreholes have been existing for many years. So far, five have been drilled while three are rehabilitated, while another three is yet to be drilled pending the availability of funds," he added.

In July, it was reported that a N\$9.2 million from a total of N\$19.2 million under the drought relief programme meant to provide water to communities in the region was unused, while Kongola constituency was at the time offered N\$1.3 million.

# Swapo is not Fishrot – councillor

The Fishrot corruption scandal which led to the arrest of senior Swapo figures should not be used as a gauge to sway voters away from the ruling party.

This is because implicated party members should be treated as individuals, Opuwo Urban constituency councillor Weich Mupya has expressed.

Mupya reiterated this on Monday while responding to questions on how the alleged mass fraud case might affect his re-election chances at November's regional council and local authority elections.

"I am not part of any criminal syndicate. I cannot be implicated in any manner in any kind of crime, may it be corruption or theft. If [Fishrot] cannot follow all of us. If a certain person has committed a crime, let it follow him. It cannot follow the group [Swapo]," he noted. The accused in Namibia's grandest corruption scandal are former fisheries minister Bernhard Esau and ex-minister of Justice Sackey Shanghala.

The two were members of the central committee - Swapo's highest decision-making body - at the time of their arrests late last year.

The scandal has since been a thorn in the ruling party's flesh, with its popularity waning drastically.

Asked the gospel Swapo will preach to retain voters in his constituency in the midst of the scandal, Mupya said Swapo's work in his constituency and by extension Namibia's quest for development speaks for itself.

"When it comes to the reputation of Swapo, it is up to the communities to judge," he said.

He added: "I don't think the residents of Kunene are so blind not to see what we are trying to do in terms of bringing development to them."

Mupya emphasised that those implicated in corruption matters should be treated as individuals and the law must be allowed to take its course.

Swapo's leadership on several occasions admitted that the scandal has attracted bad publicity and was being used by their

political opponents for expediency.

In the Fishrot case, the two ministers and five other accused are charged with corruption, fraud, money laundering and tax evasion in connection with allegations that they were in cahoots with Icelandic fishing giant, Samherji, which allegedly paid them millions in bribes between 2014 and 2019 in exchange for access to Namibia's rich fishing grounds.

## Man accused of distributing sex tape denied bail

The Oshana Magistrate's Court has remanded a 26-year-old man in custody following his appearance yesterday for allegedly distributing a sex tape involving himself and a former lover on social media. Esko Mumbala is charged with contravening Section 117 of the Communications Act of 2009 and defamation of a person. His case was postponed to 24 November for further investigations.

The complainant, who cannot be named, told *New Era* the video was filmed without her consent during October 2016. "I was married then, however, there was a misunderstanding with my husband, and we were separated since May. Due to life stress, I decided to go back to my ex. I did not know that he was filming me. But he has been sending me messages saying he will destroy and embarrass me if I did not satisfy his needs," she claimed. She further claimed that in June this year, the suspect called her demanding a cash amount of N\$15 000.

"I refused to give him money, but then he told me that he will make sure that my life is destroyed, and I will not be able to face the world. To my surprise, after two weeks I received a video from one of my relatives. I was shocked, devastated and hopeless," she added. She further narrated that although she was back together with the husband, this fresh matter has created another misunderstanding, with the husband threatening to leave her. She said this forced her to open a case against the suspect.

## Pensioner denies murdering lover

A 79-year-old man from Gobabis pleaded not guilty to a charge of murder in the Windhoek High Court for allegedly killing his live-in girlfriend with a knobkrie and panga at their residence.

According to the State, Theuns Kaneb killed 46-year-old Nora Tsusen between 9 to 10 March 2018 at the residence they shared in Kanaan location in Epako.

According to the indictment, an argument erupted between the accused and the victim and he hit her with a knobkrie, breaking three of her ribs in the process and stabbed or cut her with a panga causing her to die on the scene due to injuries caused by the blunt force trauma.

Kaneb did not provide a plea explanation and opted to remain silent and put the onus on the State to prove the allegations against him. His State-funded lawyer Giant Kauari confirmed that the plea is in accordance with his instructions and told the court the basis of their defence will become apparent during the course of the trial.

However, during his cross-examination of one of the State witnesses, Kauari said that according to his instructions from Kaneb, his client was asleep during the early hours of 10 March 2018 when he heard a knock on his door at around 04h00 in the morning.

After he received a no reply upon his enquiry into who it was, he decided to investigate and put on his cell phone's torch and went outside through his kitchen door. He further said he went to

the side where the knock came from and again asked who it was, but still received no reply.

He then decided to go back inside his house and when he turned around, he saw a man standing between him and his door armed with a panga.

"The man raised the panga high and I then threw away my cell phone and a scuffle ensued between me and the man. I did not recognise," Kaneb said.

"I managed to bite him, and he let go of the panga and ran away. I chased after him until he went out of my yard and then returned."

He went on to say that he picked up the panga discarded by the unknown man and went back inside his house. Once inside he set the panga down on the kitchen floor and when he turned to go to his room, another person jumped him from behind, he said.

At that stage, Kaneb said, he did not know who it was and he got hold of a knobkrie and started to hit his attacker with it and also took the panga to defend himself.

He further stated that it was only after he managed to switch on the lights that he realised he injured or killed his girlfriend as she was lying very still. The matter continues today before acting Judge Petrus Uengwa. The State is represented by Tangezi Itala.
