**PUBLIC CONSULTATION MEETING MINUTES:**

**PROJECT: THE PROPOSED PROSPECTING AND EXPLORATION ACTIVITIES  
ON EXCLUSIVE PROSPECTING LICENCE (EPL) NO. 10385 LOCATED  
SOUTHWEST OF OMATJETTE, IN THE ERONGO REGION, NAMIBIA**

The public consultation meeting was attended by twenty-nine (29) people, including two environmental consultants (Milika Dineinge and Aili lipinge) and one archaeologist (Justine Kashala) from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS).

**1. INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS**

The meeting was conducted by Ms. Milika Dineinge, who opened the meeting by introducing the EDS team and then stating the purpose of the consultation meeting regarding the proposed prospecting and exploration activities on EPL No. 10385 to the Interested and affected parties (I & PAs). The meeting attendance register was circulated for the attendees to sign and add their contact details, so that they could be added to the list of I&APs and receive further information on the ESA process.

**2. MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION**

The agenda of the meeting included the following main points:

**2.1 Brief Description of the Project**

Ms. lipinge explained the EIA process to the attendees, and the reason for their invitation to the meeting (with reference to the Environmental Management Act (EMA) No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations on Public Consultation). Ms. lipinge further explained the importance of the proposed project of requiring an Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC) and attendees' role in the EIA process.

### **2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts**

To ensure transparency towards the public and understanding of proposed works by the attendees, the Environmental Consultant also presented the pre-identified potential positive & negative environmental and social impacts.

### **2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)**

Ms. lipinge provided the meeting attendees with the opportunity to raise their concerns/issues and/ or comment on the proposed project activities. The issues and comments recorded are presented in **Table 1** below.

<b>4.</b>	Let us consider this meeting as provision meeting; sit with our local leaders first.	<b>AI:</b> Noted, however, we will welcome any comments or questions regarding the proposed project.

These documents will be made available through emails provided on the attendance register.

Once the review of the reporting is completed, the documents will be finalized and submitted to the Environmental Commissioner at the Department of Environmental Affairs and Forestry (DEAF) for evaluation and consideration for ECC.
