Subject: Request for exemption / consent to undertake the proposed Prospecting in Respect to Base and Rare Metals, Industrial Mineral, Precious Metals on Mining Claims 75268 and 75269, and 75270 – 75275, 75296 and 75297, within EPL 8106 (issued with a Heritage Consent No. 1/2025/77)

Enviro-Leap Consulting cc, were appointed by **Kasaya Mining cc** to facilitate on their behalf the process of obtaining an Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC) in respect to their proposed exploration and small-scale mining for Base and Rare Metals, Industrial Mineral, Precious Metals on the above-mentioned mining claims within **EPL 8106** of **KEMA Resources cc** (see attached Map).

On submitting the application (Ref: 251130006763 and 251130006765) on 03 November 2025, for Environmental Clearance to the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism (MEFT) for the proposed Mining Claims 75268 and 75269, and 75270 – 75275, 75296 and 75297 in respect to Base and Rare Metals and Semi-Precious Stones.

Locality Map: Proposed Kasaya Mining Claims No. 75296 - 75297, North-west of Ojimbongwe






