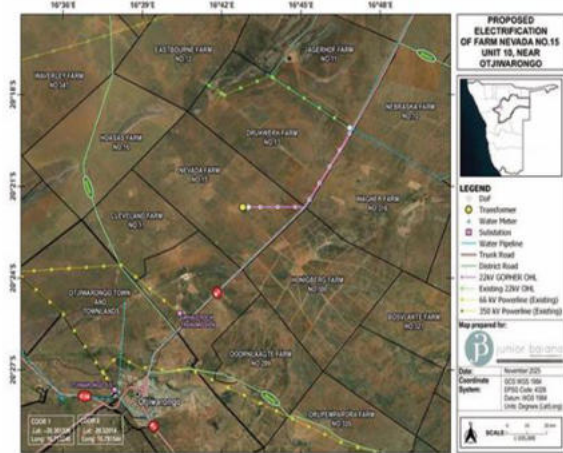

Namibia Economic Freedom Fighters (NEFF) Elton Ndlovu has urged unemployed graduates to vote for the party's presidential candidate, Epaphras Mukwilelongo, and other aspiring legislative representatives. AU election observer mission arrives in Namibia

The African Union Commission (AUC) has deployed an Election Observation Mission (AUEOM) to Namibia in anticipation of the Presidential and National Assembly elections scheduled for Wednesday. This deployment follows an official invitation from the government and the Electoral Commission of Namibia (ECN).

According to the AUC's statement, the invitation and involvement of the continental body is a demonstration of Namibia's dedication to upholding democratic principles and the rule of law.

The AUEOM is led by Dr Spaciousa Kasibwe Wandira, the former Vice President of Uganda, and consists of 47 observers drawn from a diverse array of African nations, including Benin, Central African Republic, Congo Brazzaville, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Madagascar, Mali, Mozambique, Nigeria, Senegal, South Africa, South Sudan, Tanzania, The Gambia, Togo, Tunisia, Zambia, Zimbabwe, and Uganda.

The observers represent a cross-section of ambassadors accredited by the African Union, officials from election management bodies, members of civil society organisations, election experts, human rights specialists, gender and media experts, and youth organisation representatives.

The observers will monitor the electoral process across all 14 regions, where they will monitor aspects such as the opening of polls, voting procedures, counting, and the counting process at polling stations.

According to the AUC, the mission of their assessment will be based on Namibia's legal framework governing elections, the OAU/AU Declaration on the Principles Governing Democratic Elections, the African Charter on Democracy, Elections and Governance (ACDEG), and the International Declaration of Principles for International Election

Observation

In addition to on-the-ground observations, the mission will engage with various stakeholders, including ECN, political parties, media outlets, civil society organisations, representatives of the international community based in Namibia, and other election observation missions. The AUC stated that such engagements aim to provide a holistic understanding of the electoral environment and ensure a comprehensive assessment of the electoral process. The AUEOM plans to release a

preliminary statement of its findings and assessment of the elections on 10 November.

This deployment by the African Union follows closely on the heels of the Southern African Development Community's (SADC) Electoral Observer Mission launched last

Thursday. Anne Ssemamba Malinda, a former Speaker of the Tanzanian Parliament, leads the mission, which includes 65 observers from eight member states: Eswatini, Botswana, Malawi, Mozambique, South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe, and Tanzania. These observers will also be deployed across all 14 regions of Namibia to monitor the electoral process. The insights and recommendations from both observation missions will also strengthen Namibia's electoral process and democratic institutions.

Swakopmund water pump worth N\$800k 'disappears'

A raw water pump valued at about N\$800 000 has disappeared from the raw water sewerage plant in Swakopmund. The theft was discovered in August 2024 and remains under investigation after the council's insurance claim was rejected. A report submitted to the management committee states that the stolen Grundfos pump weighed 1 490 kilograms and was removed from the plant at the corner

of Nelson Mandela Avenue and Rakotoko Street. Its size suggests that several people, using a crane and a truck, may have been involved. Triple One Investments CC, the contractor responsible for 24-hour security at the site, reported the theft. An internal investigation found it difficult to immediately hold the security company liable and raised the possibility that municipal employees may have removed the pump using municipal vehicles. In that scenario, security officers may not have known whether the

activity was authorised. The report also noted that security guards had previously questioned municipal employees operating a crane-mounted vehicle at the site. The municipality's insurance broker rejected the claim. The claim was filed after the 30-day deadline set in the policy. The insurer also said there was not enough evidence to confirm a theft, with some reports suggesting the pump may have "disappeared". The rejection was further based on the absence of forced entry and on the site not being consistently secured, both required under the

third section of the policy. The engineering and planning services department has since installed security cameras and is considering an alarm system. The management committee on Monday recommended that the general manager of engineering and planning services urgently investigate the matter and report back. It also recommended that Triple One Investments CC be held liable for the loss under its public liability insurance cover and be asked to refund the council the full N\$800 000. Other proposed steps include

requiring security guards to verify the authorisation of all drivers using municipal vehicles and keeping a detailed logbook for all equipment entering or leaving council premises. They also call for clear procedures on how redundant equipment should be disposed of. Swakopmund municipality spokesperson Linda Mapapa told the Windhoek Observer that the investigation is ongoing. "We're still investigating the disappearance of the water pump in collaboration with the security company," said Mapapa.
