Subject: Submission of Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Environmental Management Plan (EMP) Reports for the Proposed Okonjima Piggery on Okonjima Farm No. 03, Otjozondjupa Region

We hereby formally submit the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Environmental Management Plan (EMP) Reports for the proposed Okonjima Piggery on Okonjima Farm No. 03 in the Otjozondjupa Region, Republic of Namibia, in support of the application for an Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC).

The submission is made in fulfilment of the statutory requirements for environmental assessment and environmental clearance in terms of Namibian environmental legislation governing listed activities and development proposals.

Okonjima Farm No. 03 is a privately owned commercial farming property situated approximately 45 km north of Otjiwarongo in the Otjozondjupa Region. The proposed project entails the establishment and operation of a piggery facility intended to support agricultural production, local economic development, employment creation, and food security objectives, while ensuring compliance with applicable environmental and regulatory requirements.

The EIA process was undertaken in accordance with the provisions of the Environmental Management Act, 2007 (Act No. 7 of 2007), as well as the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2012 promulgated under Government Notice No. 30 of 2012. The proposed development constitutes a listed activity requiring an Environmental Clearance Certificate prior to commencement of operations.

The environmental assessment process included stakeholder consultation, identification and assessment of potential environmental and social impacts associated with the proposed development, and the formulation of appropriate mitigation and

management measures to address identified risks and impacts. These mitigation and management measures are detailed in the accompanying Environmental Management Plan (EMP).

In response to the specific information requirements, we provide the following:

9. Proof of written notice to the owners and occupiers of land adjacent to the site where the activity is or is to be undertaken, or to any alternative site

The proposed Okonjima Piggery is located on privately owned commercial farmland, namely Okonjima Farm No. 03. The proposed activity is agricultural in nature and consistent with existing farming activities undertaken within the surrounding farming area. Based on the scale, location, and operational nature of the proposed piggery, no significant adverse impacts on adjacent properties or neighbouring landowners are anticipated.

Furthermore, the proposed development is situated within an established commercial farming setting and is not expected to interfere with neighbouring land uses or activities.

10. Proof of written notice to the local authority council, regional council and traditional authority in which the site or alternative site is situated, and consent obtained

Okonjima Farm No. 03 is situated approximately 45 km outside Otjiwarongo on privately owned commercial farmland and does not fall within the jurisdiction of a local authority council or a recognised traditional authority area. The project site falls within the Otjozondjupa Region.

Given the location and jurisdictional status of the project area, no consent from a local authority council or traditional authority is applicable to the proposed development.

13. Copies of any representations, objections, or comments received in connection with the application or the scoping report

No representations, objections, or comments were received from Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) during the public consultation and stakeholder engagement process undertaken as part of the EIA study.

Furthermore, neither the Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) nor the project proponent received any concerns, objections, or written submissions relating to the proposed development during the consultation period.

We trust that the submitted reports and the above responses satisfy the requirements for review and consideration by the Ministry. We respectfully request the Ministry to

review the submitted documentation and consider the application for Environmental Clearance for the proposed development.

Piggery and abattoirs: Okonjima Piggery

Veterinarian : Mxolisi Moyo

A site visit to Okonjima Piggery was done on the above stated date. The purpose of the visit was to evaluate the piggery, abattoir and to assess the general condition of the animals that were to be slaughtered.

The piggery has a fence around its whole perimeter with its main gate (entrance) clearly labelled and properly lockable. A foot bath sits right in front of the gate and the path proceeds to a second gate put up as a security measure to prevent the pigs from escaping. The piggery structure is built from bricks and cement and is divided into two sets of pens. All pens have good drainage of excreta and are properly cleaned regularly. There are adequate fly traps in and around the unit. Food troughs are incorporated into the structure and there is portable water source. The piggery has enough natural light during the day and light sources are available during the night.

Pens are not overcrowded and the pigs are grouped according to their sizes and ages. They have an overall body condition score of 3-3.5 (On a scale of 0-5). Pigs have ear tags for identification, are fully vaccinated and dewormed and appear to be in good health.

The piggery leads into a small brick abattoir. A "V" shaped corridor connects the two facilities (piggery and abattoir). The abattoir has two openings, one for the entrance of the animals and another for the exit of the carcasses. All floors have smooth and non slip material. They are impervious and are in good condition. The drainage is also good. Portable water and hand washing areas are present. Light is adequate. Ventilation is done by fans and two whirlybirds. Two ablutions are present. One is for the red offal and one for the white offal area. The ablutions consist of a shower and toilet. There is also an office for daily management. Knives, gumboots, head helmets and aprons are temporarily being stored in the office. The ablutions have an internal roof to prevent contamination of the slaughtering process. There is cooling and freezer room for the storage of the carcasses before transportation. A 'manga' is being constructed for the stunning of the pigs. Electrical stunning equipment is also present. A electrical carcass splitter saw is also present for the cutting of carcasses. A waterbath and dehairing machines are also present on site.
