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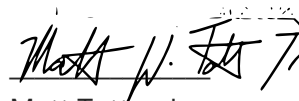

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 PURPOSE OF THE COMMENTS CONSOLIDATED REPORT

This document, compiled after the designated review period, presents the comments received from the public and registered interested and affected parties (I&APs) regarding the draft scoping report for the proposed Kokoseb Gold Mine Project on EPL 4818, within the, Erongo Region of Namibia.

The draft scoping report was completed for the Project and undertaken in accordance with the requirements of the Environmental Management Act, 2007 (Act No. 7 of 2007) and the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation, 2007 (No. 30 of 2011) gazetted under the Environmental Management Act (EMA), 2007 (Act No. 7 of 2007).

Environmental Compliance Consultancy (ECC) Pty Ltd, the appointed environmental assessment practitioner (EAP) for the project, prepared the scoping report. The report was available for public and registered I&AP review for a 14- day period from 18 November 2024 to 2 December 2024.

This document consolidates all comments received during the public review period and presents the responses from ECC and the Proponent.

2 SUMMARY OF COMMENTS FROM I&APS

2.1 INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the Regulations of the EMA 2007, on the 18th of November 2024 the draft scoping report was circulated electronically to all registered interested and affected parties (I&APs), as well as identified key stakeholders. An SMS and phone call has been received from an Okombahe resident which was collated in a separate “Comments and Responses” table that is presented in Table 1 below.

2.2 KEY FEEDBACK ON ISSUES OF CONCERN

The scoping report was provided to all I&APs, identified stakeholders and made publicly available on ECC’s website. This public review period is set out to solicit comments, feedback, and allow genuine participation in the ESIA process. Concerns were raised by an Okombahe resident, Mr Gerson Gurirab, relating to concerns regarding corporate-social responsibility by the proposed Project Proponent, and requests for additional local community and stakeholder consultations were made by various I&APs.

The key areas raised from the review of the I&APs’ comments can be summarised as follows:

Job Creation

Mr Gerson Gurirab, an Okombahe resident, requested that a database of local Okombahe companies be kept by the Project Proponent, and give such local companies preference for providing the Proponent with needed services, such as janitorial, laundry, security, etc. Mr. Gurirab provided a list of Okombahe companies in his comments so such a database could be started.

Mr Gurirab also requested that the Project Proponent open a recruitment office in Okombahe to help prioritize the hiring and employment of locals.

Social-Corporate Responsibility

Mr Gurirab also requested that the Project Proponent prioritize community upliftment through water provisioning assistance, educational bursary schemes, pensioner support, vocational and understudy training, youth programs, etc.

Requests for Additional Local Community and Stakeholder Consultation

Mr Gregory Nelwin Huseb, Secretary of the Tsiseb Conservancy Management Committee, requested that public engagements be conducted with the directly affected communities as was previously agreed to during the EAP and Proponent May 2024 stakeholder engagement meeting with the Tsiseb Conservancy. The EAP informed Mr Huseb that this May 2024 Tsiseb Conservancy request had been fulfilled by the EAP and Proponent during September 2024, as reflected in the Draft Scoping Report.

Mr Immanuel Ta Xaden Tunde, Senior Councillor of the Daure Daman Traditional Authority, stated that the Daure Daman Traditional Authority would not respond to the request for comment by the EAP on the Draft Scoping Report, and that a second stakeholder engagement be scheduled with the Daure Daman Traditional Authority instead. ECC responded that stakeholder feedback is a critical part of the ESIA process and encouraged the Daure Daman Traditional Authority to send its comments to the EAP so such comments can inform the Assessment Phase of the ESIA process.

Finally, Mr Mupenzeni Ntelamo, Chief Regional Officer of the Erongo Regional Council, requested that the EAP give a presentation to the Erongo Regional Council about the proposed Project during early 2025. ECC replied that it would be happy to do so and requested available dates from Mr Ntelamo to facilitate such a presentation in early 2025.
