STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT FOR PROPOSED SMALL-SCALE MINING ACTIVITY ON MINING CLAIMS NO. 76555 – 76559 LOCATED SOUTHEAST OF KARIBIB IN THE ERONGO REGION

Date: 9 March 2026

Venue: Farm House, Farm Ombujomenge, Karibib

An engagement meeting was scheduled and held with stakeholders and all interested and affected parties regarding Mining Claims No. 76555 – 76559 located near Karibib. The meeting was attended by various stakeholders, including representatives from the Farm owner, the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) practitioner, and the archaeologist from Savannah Environmental Consulting Services CC. The purpose of the meeting was to provide information about the proposed prospecting activities, facilitate open dialogue, and ensure that all concerns and inputs were documented for consideration in the Environmental Assessment process.

The meeting was opened with welcoming remarks, after which Mr. Mandume Leonard, the Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) from Savannah Environmental Consulting Services CC, thanked all attendees for making time to participate. He introduced himself, the consulting team, and the project proponent before presenting the meeting agenda, which followed the requirements of the Environmental Management Act, No. 7 of 2007, and its 2012 EIA Regulations (Sections 21–24) on public consultation. Copies of the Background Information Document (BID) were distributed to all participants for reference throughout the meeting proceedings, followed by the circulation of the attendance register.

Mr. Leonard explained the purpose of the meeting and provided a brief overview of the proposed project activities as outlined in the BID. He emphasised that the ongoing Environmental Scoping Assessment (ESA) study and subsequent Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC) application are specifically for the proposed small-scale mining activity. To promote transparency and ensure stakeholder understanding, Mr. Leonard presented the potential positive and negative environmental impacts anticipated from the proposed activities.

Attendees were then allowed to ask questions, express concerns, and provide input regarding the proposed project. All comments, questions, and suggestions raised during the meeting were documented and will be incorporated into the meeting minutes to inform the preparation of the ESA Report and Draft Environmental Management Plan (EMP). A summary of the key issues and responses is presented in Table 1.

Concern No.	Comment/concern	Response
1	The proponent must first sign an agreement with the farm owner before commencement of any activity on the farm	Mr.Mandume Leonard: This is well noted
2	The proponent must comply with the EMP and adhere to all mitigation measures that the EMP states	Mr. ML: Well, noted. We will share the EMP with you for your review and record
3	There is no archaeologically significant structure within the MCs	Mr. ML: Well, noted, sir. We will be going on-site, too, to verify that after this engagement .

There were no further questions or comments/concerns.

Mr. Leonard thanked everyone for making time to attend the meeting and for raising concerns and comments regarding the proposed project. He informed the attendees that the scoping report, as well as the environmental management plan, will be shared with stakeholders for their review before submission to the competent authority. The meeting was closed and was adjourned at 11H00.
